The health tip this month is about your ankles. Ankles are overlooked, and not addressed enough in exercise programs. Ankles are very important when it comes to keeping your balance. Your ankles are continually adjusting so you are able to stay upright. So let's keep them flexible and strong! There are simple exercises to do, a couple while you are sitting in a chair.

Sitting with your feet on the floor, rock your feet so you come up on both heels and then up on the balls of your feet. Do this for 30 seconds. Then move your feet from side to side pivoting on your heels as if your feet are windshield wipers. Do this for 30 sec. Now lift one foot off the floor and write the alphabet out with your foot. Make big capital letters. Do this on each side. Now stand up, and rise up on the balls of your feet 10 to 20 times. Put your hands on a counter if you need help with balance. If that's easy then do it on one foot. If you are agile, try to rise up on one foot 10 times without holding onto anything.

All these exercises work the lower leg muscles. We think of the calf muscle as "the second heart" because it works to pump blood from your lower leg back to the heart. So it helps to prevent blood from pooling in the lower leg which helps with swelling and prevents blood clots, especially after surgery.

So there you have it. Work those ankles! Remember keep moving! The weather is warming up so get out there and walk, stretch enjoy the scenery!
